In the spring of 2022, NCHSE conducted its most comprehensive review of the standards since their inception in 1992. The NHSS provide a foundation of high academic rigor and consistency for all health science programs. The standards answer the question, "What should be taught?"

NCHSE certificates answer the question, "Did students learn the content?" NCHSE certificates answer the question of how I know students learned the content.

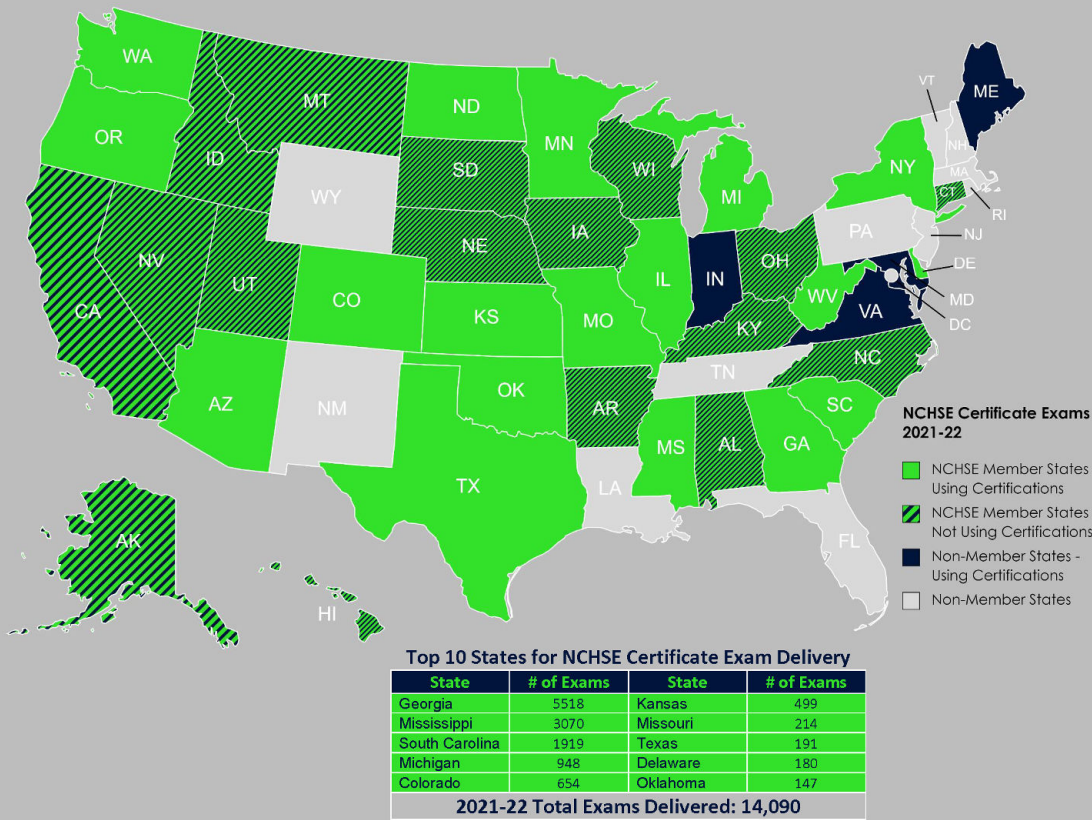

“CTE classes are set up with the backwards design model, so that the course design begins with skills and knowledge that the students must have and ends with the lessons to achieve those goals. The National Health Science Certificate is the only tool which can measure the effectiveness of the program design.

Each year, my co-teachers and I review data results by standards to see where our health science program design was weakest and which courses need to be changed. We found Standard 3: Systems was the weakest for the students on the exam. This content was covered early in the first course and not reviewed again before students completed the program. We used that information to add a senior project that studied hospital systems that they had visited in their internships. They had 100% pass the complete exam that semester!”

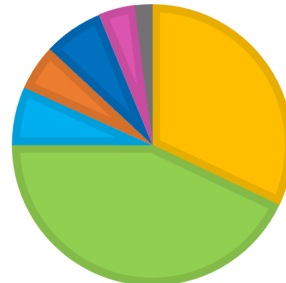
NCHSE operating funds come from four main funding sources: revenues from membership fees, from the annual conference, from certificates, and two resources the NCHSE Curriculum Enhancements and Work-based Learning Guide. Total operating revenues and gains for Fiscal Year 2022 were \$445,464.59. NCHSE total operating expenses were \$384,310.85. Net assets were \$61,153.74

Our finances continued to maintain a positive revenue flow through the 21-22 fiscal year. Outreach continues to expand, both in person and through virtual engagement. Our financial achievements have been supported by membership growth, conference attendance, and sales of the NCHSE Work-based Learning Guide.

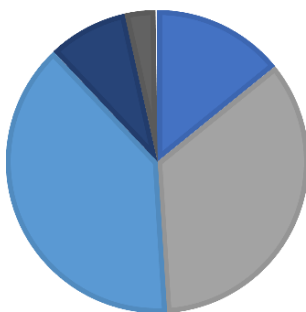

REVENUE 2021-2022 FY

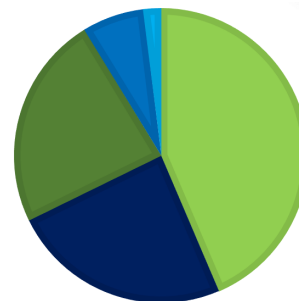

What an exciting year as we experienced the return to in-person events slowly and carefully! NCHSE was honored to offer two successful in-person events, the 2022 Annual Meeting and National Health Science Conference. There was more interaction with educators and partners throughout the year at meetings and conferences. People appeared ready to return to a new normal and continue this important work for our ultimate partner, the healthcare industry.

Nearly all health workers must be certified, licensed, or registered to practice. This results in common prescribed preparation programs in postsecondary education. The National Health Science Standards provide the same needed consistency at the high school level. Just as it is important for postsecondary education to be consistent to prepare students for the workforce, it is as equally important that high school programs to have a common system to prepare students seamlessly for postsecondary education. NCHSE welcomed input from educators and industry in our expanded standards review this year.

Certification, licensure, or registration exams are essential for postsecondary students to demonstrate competency to enter the workforce. Similarly, the National Health Science Certificate (NHSC) for high school

students indicates mastery of the National Health Science Standards. They are prepared for the rigors of postsecondary health science programs. The NHSC appears to be trending upward after the pandemic 2020-2021 year of 12,514 testers to 14,090 testers for the 2021-2022, representing a 13% increase.

Healthcare provider shortages are reaching a public health crisis. Along with our partners, NCHSE must accelerate efforts to gain support of the standards to produce better prepared postsecondary students and entry level workers. NCHSE is making a positive impact on healthcare; this affects us all. Thanks for all that you do!
